

CAMP GREY WHALE

From January to March, Baja becomes the world's epicenter of grey whales. Every year, these giants of the sea migrate to the coastal lagoons of Baja California Sur to have their young and mate, making Baja the best place in the world for grey whale watching. In addition to grey whales, it is possible to see humpback whales outside the bay, thousands of seabirds that use these areas as their winter homes, sea lions and coyotes on the islands.









Where will we camp?

Our camp is located at Magdalena Island, 20 minutes by boat from Puerto San Carlos. We camp between the dunes and the sea, on a beach where there will be no other people for several kilometers. The camp has black out glamping tents, enough shade for all our explorers, kitchen and bathroom. When we are not on safari looking for whales and other marine animals, we have paddleboards at the camp and are very well located for hiking on the island and in the spectacular dunes within walking distance of the camp.









Example itinerary:

Day 1: Arrival in La Paz. Our team will pick up the group at the airport and take you to your hotel. The rest of the afternoon is free to visit the boardwalk of La Paz. Dinner and rest.

Day 2: Departure from La Paz, BCS at 7:00am. We will pick you up at your lodging, and we will leave for Puerto Chale, the only grey whale sanctuary in the municipality of La Paz. We will do three hours of sighting and at the end, we will take the road again towards Puerto San Carlos. Once in San Carlos, we will board a boat that will take us to the camp. The rest of the afternoon is free where we will hike, and rest to leave early the next day.

Day 3: Light breakfast and start of activities at 7:00am. We will go on safari looking for whales and other marine animals. The expedition lasts approximately 6 hours. Later we will return to the camp and have the afternoon free.

Day 4: Light breakfast and start of activities at 7:00am. We go on safari looking for whales, get to know the mangroves and depending on the conditions to look for coyotes in specific places on the island. The expedition lasts 6 hours. We return to the camp to eat lunch, and the boat will take us back to Puerto San Carlos, where the driver will be waiting for us for our return to La Paz.

Day 5: Whale shark and sea lion expedition in La Paz Bay. Approximate start 9:00am. Free afternoon.

Day 6. Return home.

*The order of the expedition may vary depending on weather conditions. On weekend expeditions, the expedition will begin in La Paz. On weekday expeditions, the expedition in La Paz will be after camp.

Expedition 1- January 29 to February 3, 2025 - \$24,900mxn per person

Expedition 2 - February 2 to 7, 2025 - \$22,900mxn per person

Expedition 3 - February 12 to 17, 2025 - \$24,900mxn per person

Expedition 4 - February 16 to 21, 2025 - \$22,900mxn per person

Expedition 5 - February 26 to March 3, 2025 - \$24,900mxn per person

Expedition 6 - March 2 to 28, 2025 - \$22,900mxn per person

Minimum required: 6 people Maximum per expedition: 14 people.
